Big Notes

- Miles Byrd is the first player in Mountain West history and third player in the nation since at least the start of the 1996-97 season with 15 points (including multiple 3-pointers), 10 rebounds, six assists, four steals and three blocks in a game.
- Miles Heide, since February 18, is one of two players nationally to shoot at least 82.6 percent from the field in a minimum of 23 shots attempts.
- San Diego State is now 14-3 in its last 17 games against UNLV at Thomas & Mack Center.
- Since March 5, 2014, San Diego State is 14-3 against UNLV at Thomas & Mack Center, while the rest of the nation is 57-122.
- Since the start of the 2008-09 season, no Division I team has won more road games against a single opponent than San Diego State's 19 victories over UNLV at Thomas & Mack Center. Saint Mary's (at Loyola Marymount) and Gonzaga (at Pepperdine) are second with 16 wins.
- San Diego State's 46 victories at Thomas & Mack Center since the start of the 2008-09 campaign (27 neutral and 20 road wins) are the most by any team in any building in which it has not played at least one home game. Villanova is second with 37 victories at Madison Square Garden.

Series Notes

- San Diego State is now 44-40 all-time against UNLV, including 14-3 in its last 17 at Thomas & Mack Center.
- In the Mountain West era (since the start of the 1999-00 season) SDSU stands at 40-23 against the Runnin' Rebels, including an overall record of 22-18 at Thomas & Mack Center.
- Head coach Brian Dutcher's record against UNLV is now 12-5 overall, including 7-3 at Thomas & Mack Center.

• San Diego State is swept in the season series against UNLV for the first time since the 2012-13 campaign.

<u>Team Notes</u>

- In road games, the Aztecs are now:
 - 51-35 under Brian Dutcher
 - 65-41 versus Mountain West teams since the start of the 2013-14 season, when the current slate of teams came together.
 - 107-59 in its last 166 games against unranked opponents, including a 49-32 mark under Brian Dutcher.
- San Diego State in 7-1 on Tuesday's this season, 70-21 in its last 91 games played on the day, including 38-14 under Brian Dutcher.
- In games played in the month of March, the Aztecs are now 30-13 under Brian Dutcher and as a program is 76-30 in its last 106 March tilts.
- When San Diego State scores the first points of a game, it is now 128-27 in the Brian Dutcher era and 246-63 in its last 309 games.
- SDSU is now 16-2 this season, 173-18 under Brian Dutcher, and 236-26 in its last 262 when it takes a lead into the intermission.
- The Aztecs are now 4-8 in 2024-25, 18-50 under Brian Dutcher, and 25-93 in their last 118 contests in which they have trailed with five minutes to play.
- SDSU stands at 46-49 under Brian Dutcher, including 7-7 this year, and 86-79 in the last 165 when it loses the battle on the boards.
- San Diego State falls to 12-3 this season, 133-33 under Brian Dutcher and 177-14 in the last 211 when it forces more turnovers than it commits.
- The Aztecs are 1-6 this season, 35-53 under Brian Dutcher and 67-101 since the start of the 2010-11 season when being outshot by their opponent.

Game Flow

- Lead Changes: 11 | Ties: 11
- UNLV won the tip.
- San Diego State's Miles Byrd hit the games first bucket, a jumper, at 19:36.
- At the first media timeout, San Diego State was shooting 50.0 percent (3-of-6) and led the rebounds 5-to-3. UNLV was shooting 33.3 percent (2-of-6).
- By the second media timeout, San Diego State led UNLV in points in the paint 8-to-2 and in rebounds 10-to-8.
- Four of UNLV's first five baskets came from beyond the arc.
- At the under eight-minute media, 15 of San Diego State's 21 points came from its back court.
- San Diego State assisted on seven of its first nine buckets.
- In the first 4:34 of the second half, San Diego State was whistled for six personal fouls to one for UNLV.
- UNLV's Jaden Henley, its second leading scorer, picked up his fourth personal foul with 12:29 to play in regulation.

Nick Boyd – 19 points, 7-of-15 FG, 3-of-6 3PFG, 2-oF-6 FT, 4 rebounds, 3 assists

Reached double digits in points for the 19th time this season and 50th time in his college career ... Led the team in scoring for the 11th time this season and 18th time in his career ... Knocked down multiple 3-pointers for the 15th game in 2024-25 and 50th time as a collegiate player.

BJ Davis – 10 points, 3-of-9 FG, 4-of-6 FT, 3 rebounds, 3 assists, 1 steal

Scored in double figures for the 14th time this season and in his career ... Has scored in double figures in three of the last four games ... Has made 16 of his last 20 free throw attempts (80.0 percent) ... Has totaled seven steals in the last four games.

Miles Byrd – 15 points, 5-of-14 FG, 2-of-10 3PFG, 3-of-4 FT, 10 rebounds, 6 assists, 4 steals, 3 blocks

Is the first player in Mountain West history and third player in the nation since at least the start of the 1996-97 season with 15 points (including multiple 3-pointers), 10 rebounds, six assists, four steals and three blocks in a game

... Scored in double figures for the third straight game, 19th time this season and 21st time in his career... Recorded the first double-double of his college career ... Grabbed double digit boards for the second time in this season and in his career ... Led the team in rebounds for the fourth time this season and of his career ... Led the team in assists for the fifth time in 2024-25 and sixth time as a collegian ... Blocked at least three shots in a game for the 4th time this year and sixth time as an Aztec ... Dished out at least six assists for the fourth time in his career.

Miles Heide – 10 points, 5-of-5 FG, 1 steal

Scored in double figures for the third time this season and of his career ... Matched his career-best in points ... Has been perfect from the field for the third time in the last four games ... In the last five games he is 19-of-23 from the field (82.6 percent) ... Since February 18, he is one of two players nationally to shoot at least 82.6 percent from the field in a minimum of 23 shots attempts.
